#### INTRODUCTION

Nowadays, increasing episodes of violence, due to penetrating trauma, occur daily in civilian settings. The prompt management of victims starts on scene with a rapid evaluation and transport of the patient to referral centres, where all the technical and logistic resources are available to correctly managed the injured, after a proper instrumental assessment in emergency department.

Sound surgical technical skills are required to fix some uncommon injuries as those of torso great vessels, whereas some issues pertain the role of temporary endovascular control of haemorrhage with REBOA, or the possibility to perform non operative management of penetrating injuries in highly selected patients, are still debated.

The forensic aspects of penetrating trauma, as such as ethics and social ones, are often neglected, despite their relevant implications for both physician and victims.

Blast injuries are characterized by high incidence rate, occurrence among the masses, and difficulty in prevention whether in wartime or in peacetime. Such explosions usually result in multiple critical injuries, high infection rates, treatment difficulty, and high mortality. In peacetime, frequent terrorist bombings and various explosions have caused many casualties. With the frequent occurrence of various explosion incidents and consequently the increasingly serious threats to society, blast injuries have garnered widespread attention, and considerable efforts are being committed to related research as people have begun to truly understand the severity of injuries caused by such explosions and the necessity of proper treatment.

We have brought together several well-known national and international experts in trauma surgery, pre-hospital trauma care, disaster medicine, forensic medicine and humanitarian help, to highlight all the aspects pertaining the management of these conditions, in order to improve the knowledge and the awareness about these topic.
